Also good to see the return to the Illawarra from Western Australia of Velocette aficionado John Jennings after an absence of quite a few years. His knowledge of the Hall Green models is second to none, so, if the January meeting attendance is an indication of what the year may bring, it looks like a very good twelve months could be in store for the Illawarra branch so lets all work to keep up the enthusiasm.

Ted's Toolbox.

This is a new column to be devoted to the ordinary run-of-the-mill restorer who can elucidate on his progress and problems in the pursuit of excellence on the classic and vintage bike scene. First up deals with a 500cc Single Matchless which was registering no charge from the generator, which on this 1950 model, is a very difficult unit to get end access to the usual test procedure was carried out i.e. remove F and D connections and hook a connector across these points with a bulb in circuit and earth the other lead to the motor. Start the engine and revit up when the bulb will gradually increase in brightness, (which – unfortunately – it doesn't in this case), change the bulb leads to a multimeter and check the reading with motor running. Again zilch, zero, nil? Diagnosis, generator buggered Q.E.D. Pull off primary chaincase outer cover preparatory to generator removal from machine and lo-and-behold, no bloody chain hook-up encouraging generator to rotate. Owner then – belatedly – has a flash of memory indicating he now remembers removing chain some 12 months prior. Result 2 hours wasted time at \$87.50 per hour (mates rates). Owner need to take his memory pills, (more often)! Just a footnote to the purchase of the five Matchless alloy-motored competition machines as advertised in the December Clatter, all machines were obtained by local Illawarra members, and its been decided between themselves to form a "think tank/forum" on these particular models, pooling all knowledge and resources allied with the relevant data/photos available at A.M.C. Corner. All other Illawarra members who currently possess an example of these alloy-motored competition Singles whether in sporting form or has been grafted into a road type chassis and relevant parts is invited to join the "think tank", if such is your wish, so as to try and propagate the expansion of this rather rare – but highly desirable – example of the best-of-British design and workmanship. Occasional Saturday afternoon meetings at A.M.C. Corner are envisaged to allow owners to touch base with like-minded enthusiasts, ensuring that the end result is beneficial and advantageous to all visionaries and zealots.

Goulburn Swap Meet.

This annual event was staged on Sunday January 13th and is advertised as the great southern motorcycle only event and while it is probably the biggest swap of its kind in N.S.W., (second only to Bendigo as far as Australian ratings are concerned), nevertheless allowing the set-up day to be Saturday prompts the dealers and other like minded persons to be able to indulge in Saturday trading, so by the time "Joe Public" arrives brightly at 6am on Sunday morning sometimes having driven hundreds of kilometres, many of the (good), deals have already been run and won the previous day. As "Joe Public" probably provides, (by far), the major finance on the day its somewhat sad that they are treated as rather the "second class" citizens and are offered the "left overs" of Saturday trading. Especially galling it can be when some of the Saturday traders openly brag about the "good deals" they completed on that day. It can make genuine Sunday only buyers rather annoyed that this attitude is apparently not only allowed to happen but is receiving a blind eye turned to it!
