ATTACHMENT TO MINUTES RE CLUB'S CURRENT INSURANCES.

Motorcycling Australia Limited - Directors & Officers Liability, Company Reimbursement Liability & Errors & Omissions Insurance - Policy Numbered FD1350345 - Due to Expire 31/12/14 - "Aon Policy"

In my opinion a policy of this type (in general) should protect the elected or appointed officials (generally the committee members) and the entity, which is the legally incorporated association, in relation to potential financial losses or compensation associated with its management activities and the performance of duties of the officials.

The policy should provide an indemnity to the association and its committee members, officials and/or officers in respect of claims made against them jointly or individually arising from any "Wrongful Act" committed or allegedly committed by them in their capacity as an office bearer of the club or association. (There is would be no cover for criminal acts or intentional acts of dishonesty). "Wrongful acts" are defined in the existing "Aon" policy wording - these include: miss-statements, negligent acts, errors or omissions or breach of duty or breach of power of authority etc. Claims may arise out of actions from third parties or regulatory authorities etc.

CORRESPONDENCE TO AON INSURANCE BROKERS:

Brendan, Can you confirm that the Associations Liability policy covers "Directors & Officers" of our club being:

1. Only the elected members of our clubs committee.

or

2. Only the elected members of our clubs committee and the various elected officials such as Machine Examiners etc. (see our Web site www.cemcc.org.au for details of office bearers for 2014).

or

3. Covers all members of our club.

CORRESPONDENCE FROM TO AON INSURANCE BROKERS:

Hi Kim,

I have now received feedback from our financial lines team who specialise in this type of policy.

I understand that the definitions of Directors and Officers are not clear or helpful in determining who is covered.

The definition of each is defined under the Corporations Act.

So long as the person fits within these definitions then they are covered under the policy, subject to the terms and conditions.

I trust this provides you with clarification but please let me know if you have any further queries.

I now provide the "Definition" under the "Corporations Act" as follows:

"Director" of a company or other body means:

(a) A person who:

(i) Is appointed to the position of a director; or

(ii) Is appointed to the position of an alternate director and is acting in that capacity;

Regardless of the name that is given to their position; and

(b) Unless the contrary intention appears, a person who is not validly appointed as a director if:

(i) They act in the position of a director; or

(ii) The directors of the company or body are accustomed to act in accordance with the person's instructions or wishes.

"Officer" of an entity that is neither an individual nor a corporation means:

(a) A partner in the partnership if the entity is a partnership; or

(b) An office holder of the unincorporated association if the entity is an unincorporated association; or

(c) A person:

(i) who makes, or participates in making, decisions that affect the whole, or a substantial part, of the business of the entity; or

(ii) Who has the capacity to affect significantly the entity's financial standing.

The aforementioned definition merely confuses the issue and should only be relied on in concert with the Aon Policy "Definitions".

The Aon Policy defines as follows:

"Director or Officer" shall mean:-

(i) Any natural person who is or was or may hereafter be a Director or Officer of the Company or is

Construes [sic] so to be within the meaning of any applicable law or regulation governing such matters...."

(b) "Company" shall mean the Company or other organisation stated in the Schedule."

I feel that it would be prudent for the CEMCC Inc. to provide MNSW with a full list of all club officials as shown in the front of our "Clatter" magazine. This listing to MNSW should be sent annually and/or whenever there is change to its detail. The club should also request confirmation from MNSW and Aon that these club officials are protected by the "Motorcycling Australia Limited - Directors & Officers Liability, Company Reimbursement Liability & Errors & Omissions Insurance" Policy.

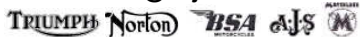
