Further to my previous general advice, and in response to correspondence received from CEMCC Inc Illawarra Branch -

I am still of the opinion that the CEMCC Inc should provide MNSW with a full list of all club officials as shown in the front of the "Clatter" magazine. This listing should be sent to MNSW annually and/or whenever there is a change to its detail. The club should request confirmation via MNSW from Aon (Insurance Brokers) that these club officials are protected by the "Motorcycling Australia Limited - Directors & Officers Liability, Company Reimbursement Liability & Errors & Omissions Insurance" policy issued by Certain Underwriters at Lloyds of London.

Failing the success of the aforementioned, I would recommend the club obtain their own "Directors & Officers Liability" insurance. My brokerage could provide a quotation for consideration - an example of a seamless policy wording definition may read as follows:

*"Definitions - Officer - any person who has been, now is or shall become a duly elected director or trustee, a duly elected or appointed officer, a committee member, an employee of Yours or a member but only whilst that member is acting in a voluntary capacity on Your behalf and in accordance with the directions of Your board of directors or committee of management."*

After this new policy is in force the existing MNSW coverage could be lapsed leaving only the "Public & Products Liability Insurance" current via MNSW.

Who dribbles his food . . . . . and makes no reply.  
When you say in a loud voice . . 'I do wish you'd try!  
Who seems not to notice . . . the things that you do.  
And forever is losing . . . . . A sock or shoe?  
Who, resisting or not . . . . . let's you do as you will,  
With bathing and feeding . . . . The long day to fill?  
Is that what you're thinking? . Is that what you see?  
Then open your eyes, nurse . you're not looking at me.  
I'll tell you who I am . . . . . As I sit here so still,  
As I do at your bidding, . . . . . as I eat at your will.  
I'm a small child of Ten . . with a father and mother,  
Brothers and sisters . . . . . who love one another  
A young boy of Sixteen . . . . . with wings on his feet  
Dreaming that soon now . . . . . a lover he'll meet.  
A groom soon at Twenty . . . . my heart gives a leap.  
Remembering, the vows . . . . that I promised to keep.  
At Twenty-Five, now . . . . I have young of my own.  
Who need me to guide . . . And a secure happy home.

Dark days are upon me . . . My wife is now dead.  
I look at the future . . . . . I shudder with dread.  
For my young are all rearing . . . young of their own.  
And I think of the years . . . And the love that I've known.  
I'm now an old man . . . . . and nature is cruel.  
It's jest to make old age . . . . . look like a fool.  
The body, it crumbles . . . . . grace and vigor, depart.  
There is now a stone . . . where I once had a heart.  
But inside this old carcass . A young man still dwells,  
And now and again . . . . . my battered heart swells  
I remember the joys . . . . . I remember the pain.  
And I'm loving and living . . . . . life over again.  
I think of the years, all too few . . . gone too fast.  
And accept the stark fact . . . that nothing can last.

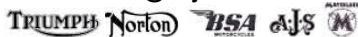
