General Business. -

Membership requirements: - Discussion re ensuring active membership. We have no requirement to register bikes or accept membership of members who do not make any attempt to be active members. David Scott to draft up a welcoming letter setting out these requirements.

This was discussed at length and the membership unanimously opposed changes from a hard copy to emailed digital copy and directed the Secretary to write a letter to the President, David deLapp, informing him of the Orange Branch members' views on this matter. Some members do not have computers or email addresses. They pointed out that they have no way to email Alan Harper. There was confusion over the purpose of this email- see David's emails and contradictory details in the Clatter.

As a last resort one member suggested that a bimonthly magazine would be better than a digital one. Members appreciate the need to contain costs, but expressed doubts that any savings could deliver many of the benefits listed in the Clatter -
